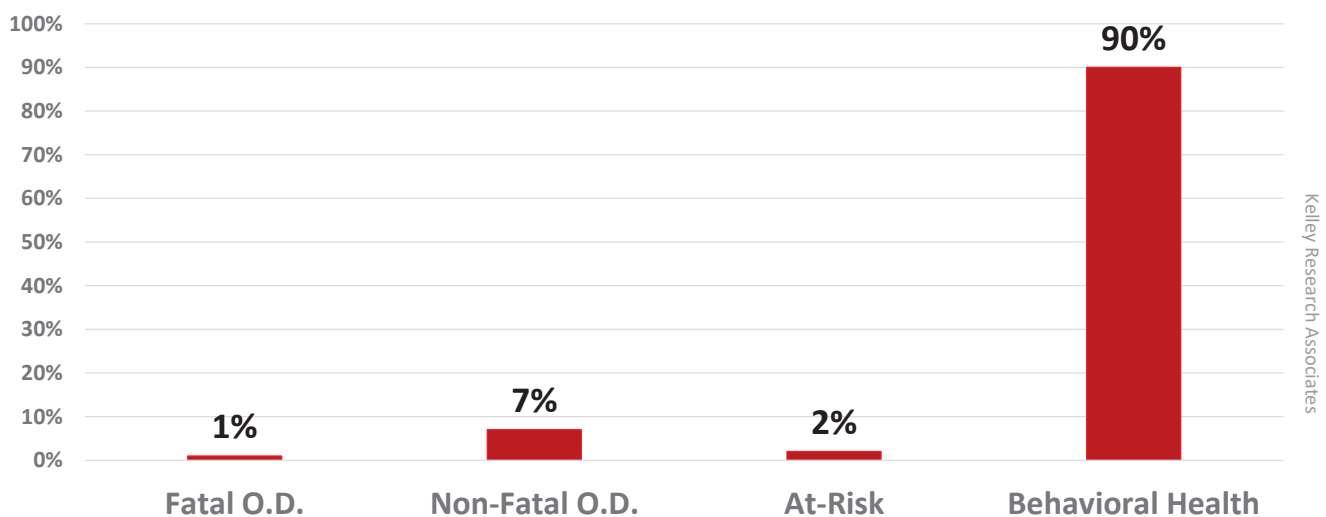

Swansea Annual Trend Data

1/1/23 – 12/31/25

Type of Incident: 1/1/23 – 12/31/25



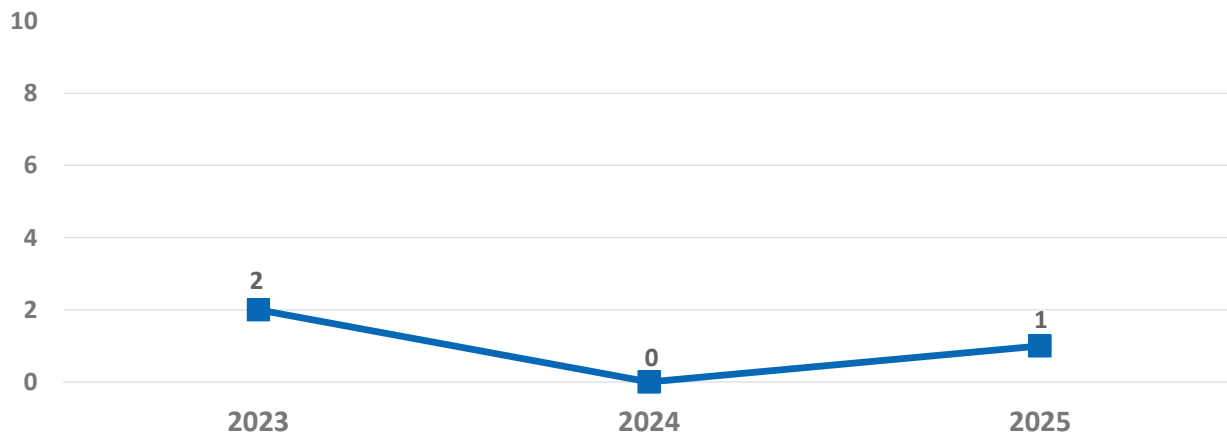
There were a total of **501 incidents (OD, At-Risk referrals, and Behavioral Health events)** recorded by Swansea PD between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25: **3 (1%) were fatal ODs; 37 (7%) were non-fatal ODs; 11 (2%) were categorized as “at-risk” individuals, and 450 (90%) were identified as behavioral health events.**

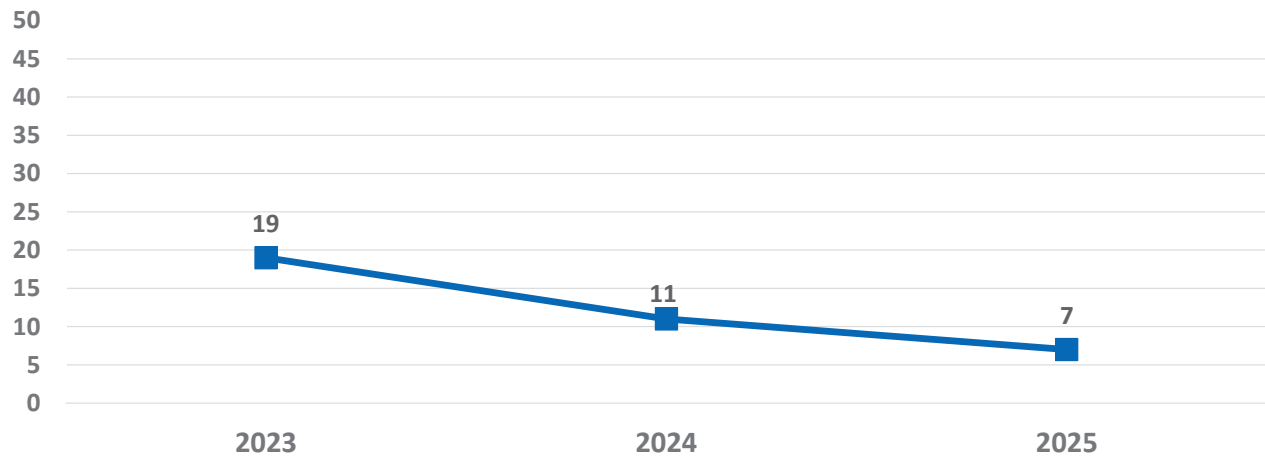
There was on average 1 fatal OD per year during this time period, or a total of 3 fatal overdoses. Fatal overdoses have remained fairly stable between 0 and 2 per year throughout this time frame.

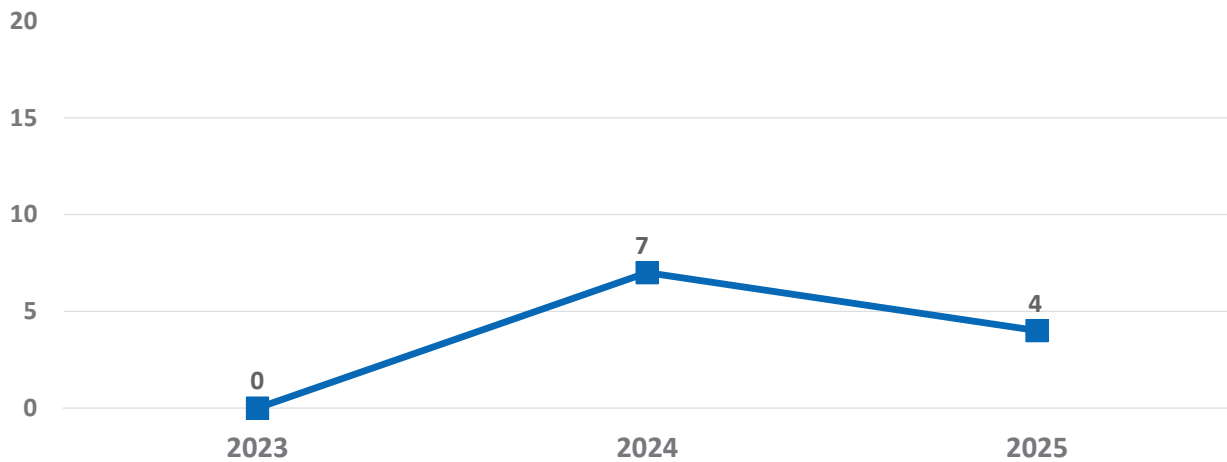
There were on average 12 non-fatal OD incidents per year, during this time period, or a total of 37. There has been a steady decline in non-fatal overdoses with an overall 63% decrease between 2023 (19) and 2025 (7).

At-Risk Monthly Trend



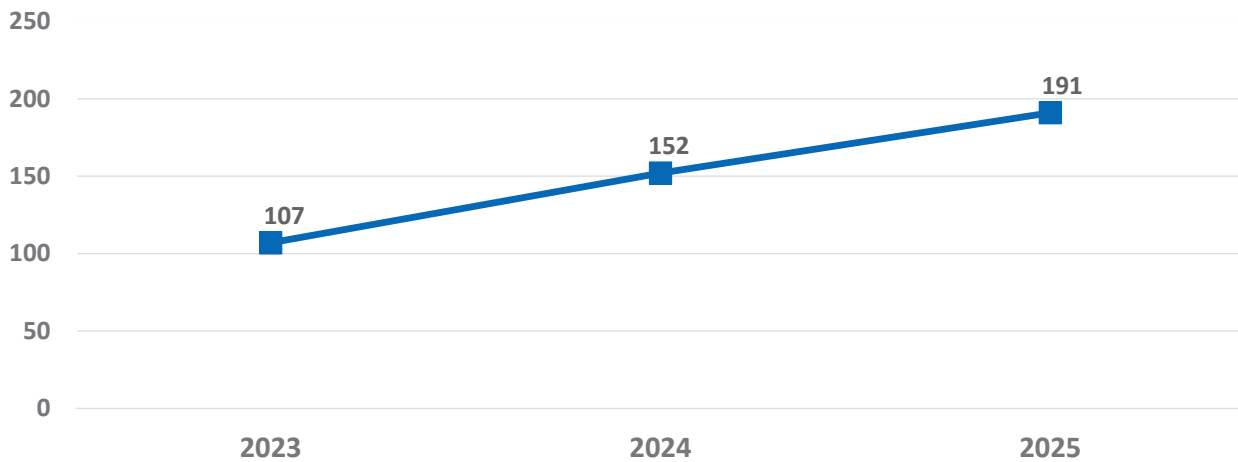

There were on average 3.7 at-risk referrals per year, during this time period, or a total of 11. Swansea PD began using the at-risk module in 2024, identifying 7 individuals who were at-risk for an overdose or behavioral health event. There was a 43% decrease in at-risk referrals between 2024 (7) and 2025 (4).

Behavioral Health Events

There were on average 150 behavioral health events, during this time period, or a total of 450. Behavioral health events have experienced a steady increase over the past three years, with an overall 79% increase between 2023 (107) and 2025 (191).

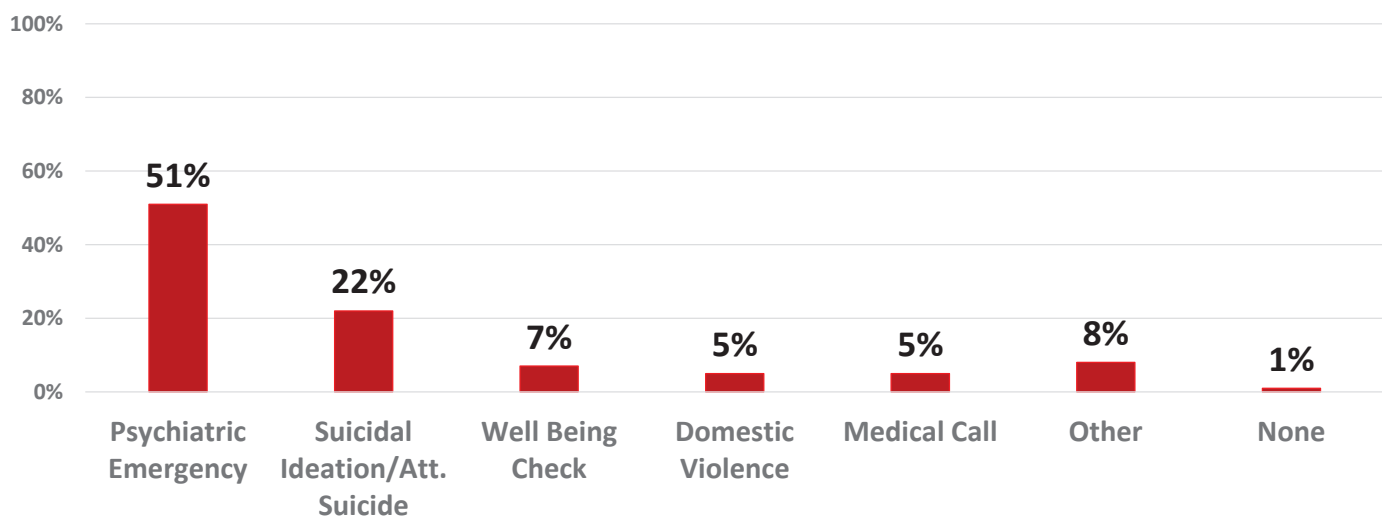

Behavioral Health Event Information

The following analysis includes information on just the Behavioral Health events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25 (450).

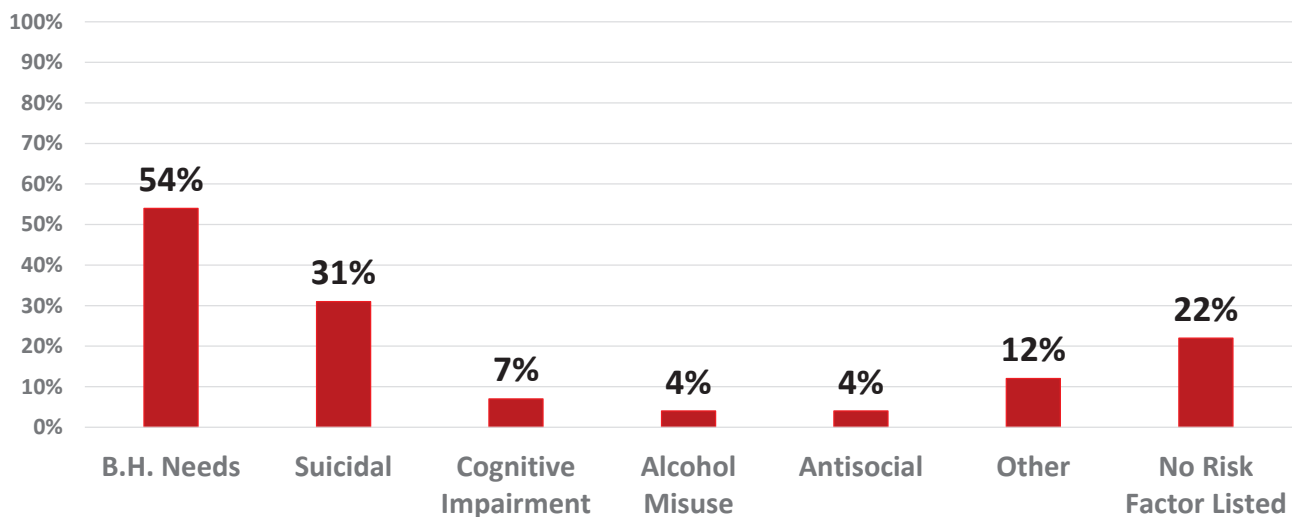
Type of BH Incident: 1/1/23 – 12/31/25



Over half, **51% (230)**, of the Behavioral Health events were recorded as psychiatric emergencies and another **22% (100)** were recorded as suicidal ideation or attempted suicides.

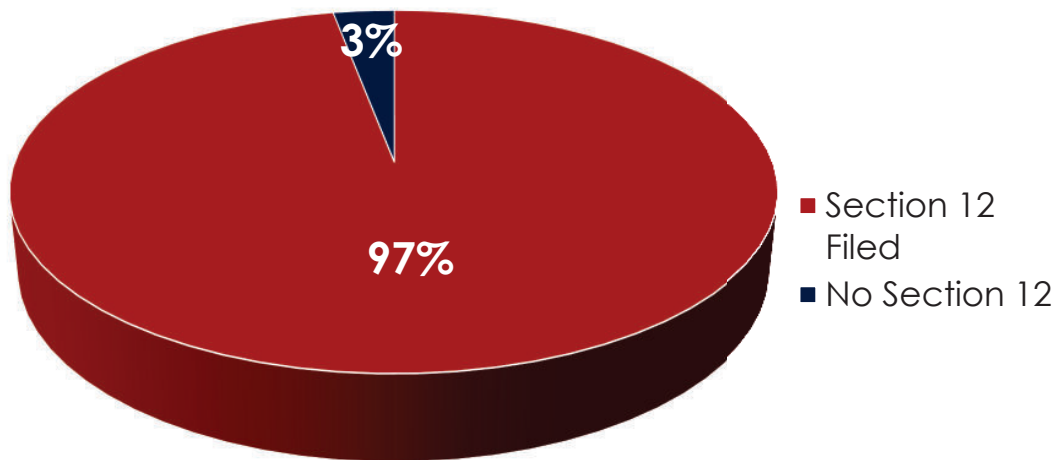
BH Risk Factors



This data can add to more than 100% due to multiple risk factors identified at each incident. The majority of incidents, [54% \(243\)](#), noted behavioral health needs as a risk factor, [31% \(140\)](#) noted the individual was suicidal, and [7% \(31\)](#) noted the individual had cognitive impairment.

Section 12 Data

(Application for Temporary Involuntary Hospitalization)



The vast majority, 97% (435), of the behavioral health incidents resulted in filing a Section 12 for the individual involved.



Demographic Data

The following analysis includes information on individuals involved in all overdose incidents, at-risk referrals, and behavioral health events (501).



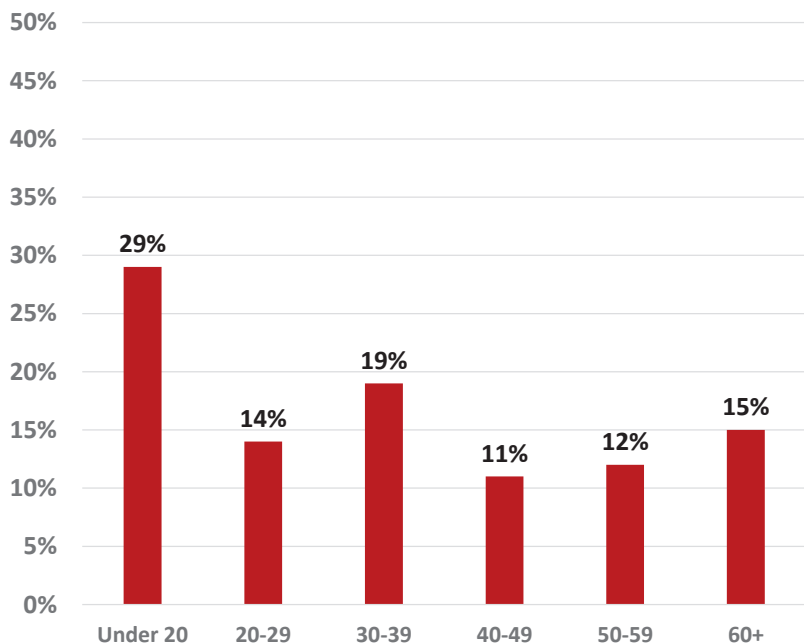
Total Individuals Involved

- ❑ The 501 overdose incidents, at-risk referrals, and behavioral health events involved **303 unique individuals:**
 - **237 (78%)** individuals had one event recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **30 (10%)** individuals had two events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **13 (4%)** individuals had three events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **5 (2%)** individuals had four events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **7 (2%)** individuals had five events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **5 (2%)** individuals had seven events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **1 (<1%)** individual had eight events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **1 (<1%)** individual had nine events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **1 (<1%)** individual had twelve events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **1 (<1%)** individual had fourteen events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
 - **2 (1%)** individuals had sixteen events recorded between 1/1/23 and 12/31/25.
- ❑ The **66 individuals** with multiple events were involved in **264 (53%)** of the recorded incidents/referrals during this time frame.

Unique Individual Demographics



- **58% (177)** are male
- **91% (276)** are categorized as White
- **3% (10)** were listed as homeless.
- Almost half, **43% (131)**, of the individuals were 29 years old or younger.
- The youngest individual **was 8 years old** (Behavioral Health event) and the oldest was **92 years old** (Behavioral Health event).



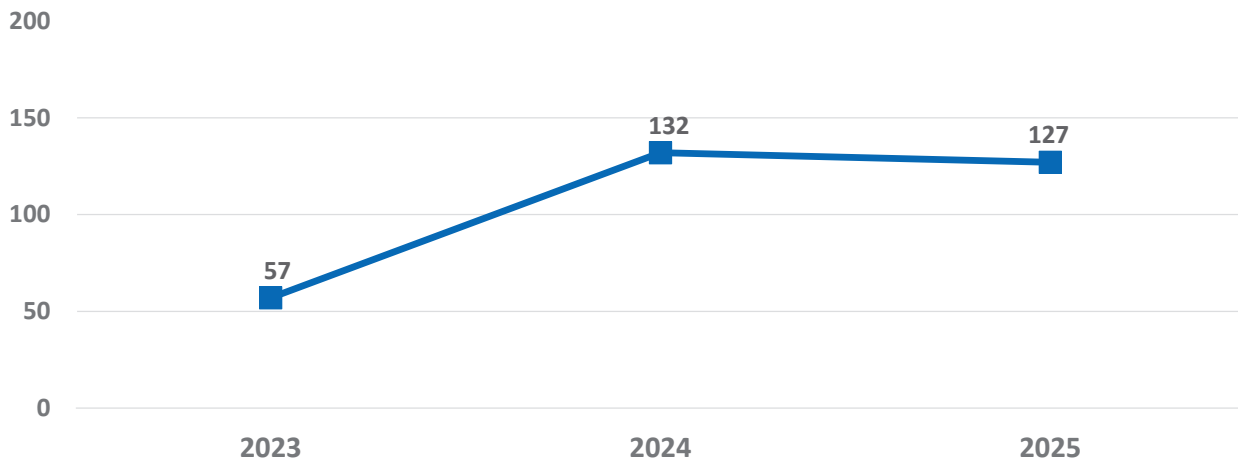


Post Incident or At-Risk Follow-Up Visit Outcomes

Attempted Follow-Up Contact Trend

The number of attempted outreach contacts being recorded in CIMS saw a significant **132% increase** between 2023 (57) and 2024 (132). As a reminder, Swansea PD began utilizing the BCO clinicians as outreach support in September 2023.

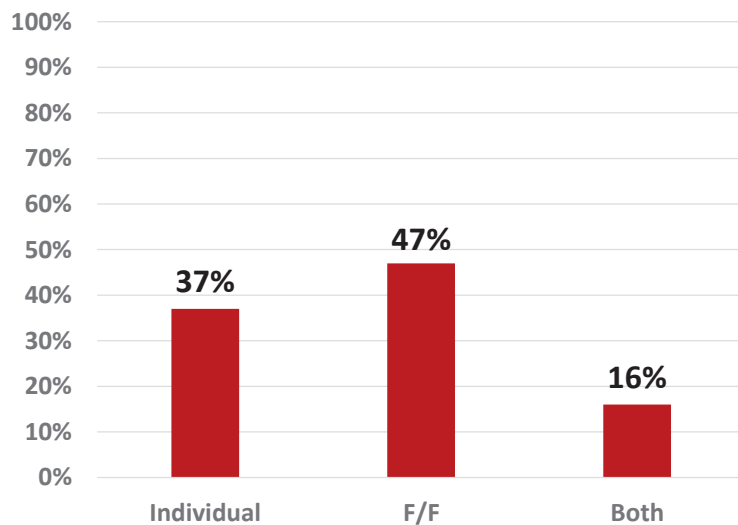

Follow-Up Visit Contacts: 1/1/23 – 12/31/25

- **316** attempted Follow-up Contacts
- **58% (183)** were successful in having contact with either the individual who was involved in the incident/referral, a family/friend, or both.



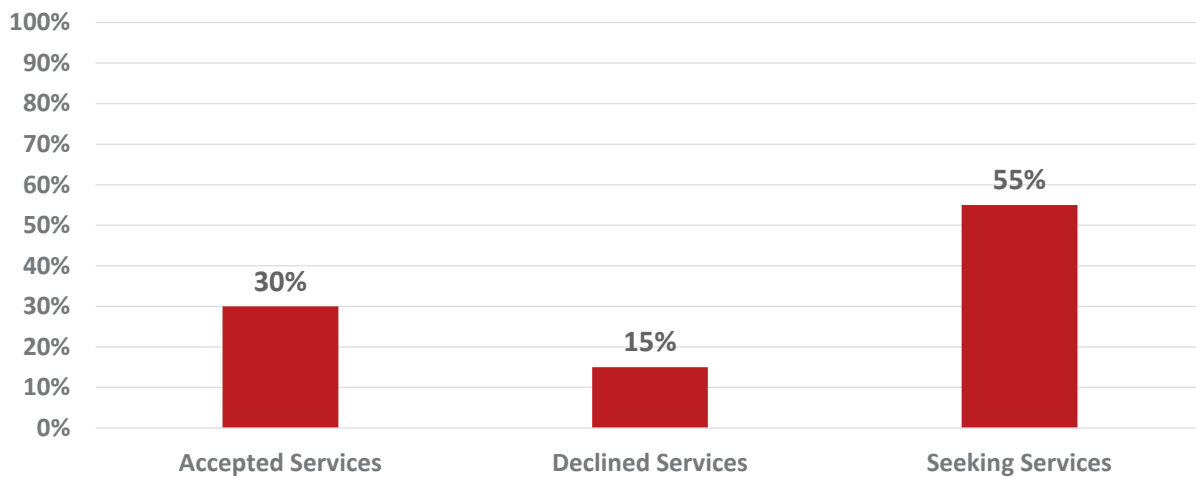
Thirty-seven percent (68) of the successful follow-up visits (183) resulted in contact with the individual that was involved in the incident/referral, **47% (86)** resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and **16% (29)** resulted in contact with both the individual and family/friends.

Successful Client Contact Outcomes

Of the 97 successful contacts with the person that was involved in the incident/referral (Individual Only and Both): **30% (29)** resulted in the individual accepting resources and information from the outreach team; **15% (15)** of the individuals declined the offered resources, and **55% (53)** of the individuals were already seeking services by the time the team made contact.

Additional Follow-Up Contact Outcomes

- Of the **118** successful follow-up contacts where a family/friend was contacted, **32% (38)** resulted in the family/friend accepting support services from the Outreach Team.
- Records from **109 (60%) of the successful visits (183)** noted that a referral to local service providers or agencies was provided.
- Records from **3 (1%) of all attempted visits (316)** noted that Naloxone was provided to the individual or left at the door.
- Records from **6 (2%) of all attempted visits (316)** noted that a resource packet/pamphlet was provided to the individual or left at the door.
